The Minutes of the Annual Parish Meeting held on Monday 8<sup>th</sup> of April 2019 in the Schoolroom, Crafthole Methodist Chapel, Crafthole, commencing at 6:30pm.

- 4. INFORMATION & PRESENTATION FROM LOCAL GROUPS.
  - Short Mat Bowls: Mr D Dunn. This club meets on Monday @2pm and Friday @7:00pm, in the Memorial Hall. They are in the Eastern Cornwall league, 2<sup>nd</sup> division. It's great fun and new members always welcome. The club has a range of woods(bowls) for anyone to use and if tuition is required it's freely available.
  - Sheviock C.E Church. As St Mary's had to close whilst major work is carried out, the Methodist Chapel has kindly offered the use of Crafthole Methodist Church for the services. This is very much appreciated. All services begin at 9am. First Sunday each month -Family Service. Second and 4<sup>th</sup> Sunday -Holy Communion. Third Sunday of month -Morning Worship. Work is progressing well at St Mary's, the weather vane should be reinstated shortly so the scaffolding on the spire can be removed and hopefully access to the church yard will improve. Every House in the Parish has received a copy of Fund raiding events for 2019. Ranging from Cream teas, Strawberry feasts, pasty lunches to soirees, concerts, crafts and heritage days.

Cllr Brooks provided information about the **Crafthole Preschool:** 

This operates from the Memorial Hall with fantastic facilities, lovely outside area - for free flow play and additional use of grassy field for Outdoor learning. They run term time, weekdays 09:30 - 12:30 with lunch club from 12:30 -1:30pm. This will extend to 2:30 on two weekdays to meet local needs. They run a Toddlers group on Friday (term time) from 1pm -2:30pm. Contact Paula Brooks 07900553116.

Mrs B. Snowling provided the information regarding the following clubs.

- Badminton: Wednesdays at the Memorial Hall. 5:30- 6:30pm children aged 7-11, 6:30-8pm Senior school age. They have 18 children altogether plus visiting children. Adults 8pm onwards. For all sessions, rackets are available and all welcome. Contact Mrs B. Snowling
- **Keep fit gently**: Thursday 2:15 -3:15pm Contact Mrs B. Snowling. This is run on an adhoc pay as you go basis, after covering the cost of the hall any extra goes to the Hospice for children, so far they have raised over £2000. The age group ranges from 50-96 years, all are welcome, you can sit on a chair or stand but by the end of the session you will have gently moved every joint in your body. No judgment on ability is made just do what you can and have some fun at the same time.
- **Methodist Chapel Crafthole**: 10:30 Sunday service. They also hold United joint services. The noticeboard outside of the church displays all service times. All welcome, it would be lovely to see more people.

- Mr Michael Snowling spoke about the Sheviock Memorial Hall located in Crafthole: It is the centre of the parish community housing many clubs, fundraising events, private hire functions and parties, even the Cubs have taken it over for a weekend. The volunteer Trustee committee is made up of one member from each community organisation, with 16 members on it. Their aim is to raise money to keep costs down of hiring hall to a minimum this may be through community events or via the addition of solar panels to provide electricity. This summer the exciting new extension to the Lounge room will be completed. This extension will be self-contained with own toilet facilities so will not intrude on the preschool. But it also has the ability via sliding doors to connect and open to the lounge doubling it in size. They are working with the Rame community Fund to explore opportunities to create clubs for young people.
- **Snooker Club**, Memorial Hall. There is a separate room holding a full-size table. For £16 per year you can join and come and have a game. Cues are available on site.
- Short Tennis Tuesday 2:30 and Thursday at 7:30 at the Memorial Hall. Contact Mike Claughton.
- Whist takes place in the memorial Hall Lounge, Tuesdays from 7:15 cost £2:50 and covers raffle.
- W.I. This club meets every 3rd Wednesday of the month @ 2pm in the Memorial Hall. New members always welcome, simply come along to the meeting.
- **Body Beautiful Ballet**. Is a class based on strength, balance and flexibility. 8-9pm Tuesdays at the memorial Hall £5 per session.
- Yoga. 5pm, Fridays in the Memorial hall. Maintain and improve your flexibility.
- The Garden Club: 3rd Monday each month at 7pm in the memorial Hall. Cost £10 per garden. Plus £1 subs per meeting covers tea and biscuits. They are looking forward to the extension of the village hall and often have days out either via the use of the Community Bus or self-drive.
- Whitsand Bay Golf Club: Mr Andy Welch representing the golf club spoke about the exciting new changes taking place since December. Antony Estate are investing heavily into the product and land management. Including a wildlife pond and wildflower meadow and playing surfaces investment. It has seen an increase in 60 members in the last 2 months. It has lowered membership costs as it is important to encourage more members from the local community. There are free taster sessions. Juniors are on a Saturday one of whom will be the captain of Cornwall next year. They have a planning application to increase and improve the Club House facilities for golfers plus, social membership will give discounts within, although you will not have to be a social member to eat/drink at the Club House.
- The chair thanked all for sharing their information about the many different opportunities on offer within the parish.
