SHEVIOCK PARISH PLAN April 2024.

The following is a revised list in order of Priorities, following completion of other tasks.

The Priority items are:

- 1. Improvements to Traffic through Crafthole. Follow up Virtual meeting to be held with Highways to finalise, prior to Public consultation. To push for change to signage currently directing traffic off the A374 through Crafthole. Improvements to diversionary signage for all road works. Improvement/restoration and repainting of Virtual pavement, increase parking for residents. Methods to improve flow of traffic through the terraces.
- 2. Parish Defibrillators. Each have guardians who upload info onto "the Circuit." Clerk oversees. The Memorial Hall sponsors one defib unit to help fund batteries and pads. Aim to find more organisations/businesses to adopt each parish Defibrillator. To organise training for parishioners.
- 3. **Sheviock Permissive footpath**. Currently Seeking route/permissions from Antony and safety analysis from Highways.
- 4. Road safety improvements Polscoe Hill/Tredis Turn Off. White road markings repainted, inclusive of SLOW on road. Hedge cut back and re-laid. Awaiting Cornwall Highways road safety team inspection, following request plus suggestion of additional chevron/speed reduction.
- 5. Coastal Defences/Sea Wall repairs/Improvements, Portwrinkle. Clerk has reported and annotated, via online map, the areas of defects in existing sea defences. The Parish Council has requested information regarding how CC Highways will future proof Finnygook Lane/road access to Portwrinkle due to rapid cliff erosion on area of private land adjacent to Jolly Roger café and car park.
- 6. **A374 speed limit review road safety/ speeding through Sheviock.** Seeking Safety Improvements through Sheviock Village and along the A374.

The following are other items being worked on projects although the priorities are listed above.

- Basic refurbishment/improvements Public Toilets. When funds allow/grants available.
- Removal and replacement of old wooden play park equipment, Crafthole.
- Digital Real Time Displays at Parish Bus Shelters. Advised by CC that they are unreliable. Following quotes also deemed too expensive for SPC to purchase with continued cost to run and maintain. Website "Where's My Bus? "Posters to be installed at each shelter. As can show where actual bus is on the route map/via mobile phone.
- Permissive footpath project feasibility and permissions Crafthole East, B3274. Currently Seeking route/permissions from Antony and safety analysis from Highways.
- Increase and encourage Community engagement (i.e. encouragement to help via Newsletter) for events/committees/ Play park monitors/ Defibs guardians/ Green initiatives/footpath monitors.
