PRESENTATION: Presentation should be as attractive as possible.

- 3. CLASS ENTRY FEE for exhibits:

ADULTS: 20p per item for the first 15 items, 10p each item thereafter.

CHILDREN: Free. Children are able to enter all adult classes at no cost but will be judged anonymously and only on merit.

- 4. No exhibits will be accepted for Handicrafts, Art or Photography which have previously been shown at the Crafthole Show.
- 5. Only ONE ENTRY PER CLASS PER PERSON.
- 6. R.H.S. rules will apply to all Cut Flowers & Fruit & Vegetable judging. Women's Institute rules apply to Cookery, Preserves and Drinks.
- 7. Exhibits NOT removed after the awards ceremony at 3.15pm and before the auction at 3.30pm will be sold off in the auction (excepting Handicraft, Art and Photography).
- 8. The committee take no responsibility for loss or damage to property.
